"The following drama takes place on the Sunday of the Passion. Its purpose is to allow us as worshipers suddenly to discover (pitifully, intensely, truly to discover) our own rootedness in the drama which is Christ's, so that the Passion Story may no longer be mere story for observance, analysis, learning or history; so that it embraces us, names us and becomes our own story indeed: the shape of our being.

Therefore, all senses are enlisted: sight, sound, the rhythm of both, music and motion, and the feel of each worshiper's voice in our throat and our emotions in our breasts. This drama has no audience. All are actors. None objective. All subjective, or else the objects of the driving love of God."

1. THE ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM

Narrator: When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, 'Go into the village opposite. There you will find tied a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this: "The Lord needs it." So those who were sent, departed and found it as he had told them.

Peter: They said, "The Lord has need of it." Then they brought it to Jesus, andthrowing their garments on the colt, they set Jesus upon it.

Narrator: As he rode along, the people spread their cloaks on the road. As he was drawing near, at the descent of the Mount of Olives, the wholemultitude of the disciples began to rejoice and to praise God with aloudvoice for all the deeds of power that they had seen.

Indeed, the days will come upon you, when your enemies will set up a bank about you and hem you in on every side. They will dash you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave one stone upon another; because you did not recognize the time of your visitation from God.'

2. THE PREPARATION OF THE LAST SUPPER

Narrator: Now, the feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called the Passover. The chief priests and the scribes were looking for a way to put Jesus to death, for they were afraid of the people.

Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was one of the twelve; he went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers of the temple police about how he might betray him to them. They were greatly pleased and agreed to give him money. So he consented and began to look for an opportunity to betray him to them when no crowd was present.

Narrator: Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, 'Go and prepare the Passover meal for us that we may eat it.'

People: They asked him, 'Where do you want us to make preparations for it and what are we to do?"

Narrator: 'Listen,' he said to them, 'when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you; follow him into the house he enters and say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks you, 'Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' "He will show you a large room upstairs, already furnished. Make preparations for us there.' So they went and found everything as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover meal.

When the hour had come, he took his place at the table and the disciples with him. Hesaid to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover withyou before Isuffer. For I tell you, I shall not eat it until itis fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

He took bread andwhen he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it tothem, saying, "This is mybody which is given for you. Do this inremembrance of me."

Likewise thehe took a cup after supper, saying, "This cup which ispoured out for you is the newcovenant in my blood. I tell you thatfrom now on I shallnot drink ofthe fruit of the vine until the kingdomof God comes."

Narrator: Nowbehold the hand of him who betrays me is with meat the table. For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined; but woe to thatman by whom he is betrayed!"

People: Then they began to question, "Who, Lord? Who is to betray you? Is it I? Is it I?"

Narrator: He answered, "He who has dipped his hand in the dish with me willbetray me.Oh, it would have been better for that man if he had notbeen born."

Judas: Judas, who betrayed him, said, "Is it I, Master?"

Narrator: Jesus said to him, "You have said so." (A moment of silence as Judas walks away)

Peter: Simon Peter was indignant. "But not I!" he said. And he declared, "Though they all fall away from you, I will never leave you."

Narrator: "Peter, truly I say to you, this very night, before thecock crows, you will deny me three times."

Peter: Peter said to him, "Even if I must die with you, I willnever deny you!"

People: And all of the disciples said the same, over and over again.

3. THE AGONY IN THE GARDEN

People: "Go to Dark Gethsemane" ELW 347(vs. 1)

Go to dark Gethsemane, all who feel the tempter's power; Your redeemer's conflict see, watch with him one bitter hour; Turn not from his griefs away; Learn of Jesus Christ to pray.

Narrator: He came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples followed him. When he came to the place he said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation."

People: Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us, deliver us.

Narrator: Then he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt downandprayed, "Father, if thou art willing, remove this cup from me; nevertheless, not my will, but yours be done."

People: Our Father in heaven, hallowed beyour name.

Your kingdom come; Your will be done. Your will be done.

Your will be done.

Narrator: When he got up from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping, because of grief, and he said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Get up andpray that you may not enter into temptation."

People: Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, even the evilwithin ourselves.

Judas: While he was still speaking, there came a crowd, and the one calledJudas, one of the twelve, was leading them. He drew near to Jesus to kissHim.

Narrator: But Jesus said to him, "Judas, would you betray the Son of Man with akiss?"

Judas: At once he came up to Jesus and said, 'Greetings, Rabbi!' and kissed him.

People: When the disciples saw what would follow, they said,"Lord, shall we strike with the sword?"

Peter: Then one of them struck the slave of the high priestand cut off his right ear.

Narrator: But Jesus said, "No more of this!" And he touched his ear and healed him.

People: Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

Narrator: Then Jesus said to the chief priests, the officers of the temple police, and the elders who had come for him, "Have you come out with swords and clubs as if I were a bandit? When I was withyou day after day in the temple, you did not lay hands on me, But this isyour hour and the power of darkness." Then they seized him.

4. THE JUDGMENT

People: Go to Dark Gethsemane (vs. 2) ELW 347

Follow to the judgment hall, view the Lord of life arraigned; Oh, the wormwood and the gall! Oh, the pangs his soul sustained! Shun not suffering, shame, or loss; learn from him to bear the cross. **Narrator:** Then they seized him and led him away, bringing him into the HighPriest'shouse.

Peter: Peter followed at a distance. When they had kindled a fire in themiddle of the courtyard and sat down together, Peter sat among them.

People: Then a maid, seeing him sitting in the firelight, stared at him and said, "This man also was with him."

Peter: But he denied it, saying, "Woman, I do not know him."

People: A little later someone else, on seeing him, said, 'You also are one of them.'

Peter: But Peter said, "Man, I am not."

People: An hour later another insisted, saying, "Surely this man also waswith him; for he is a Galilean."

Peter: But Peter said, "Man, I do not know what you aresaying!"

Narrator: At that moment, while he was still speaking, the cockcrowed. And the Lord turned and looked at Peter.

Peter: Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he hadsaid to him, "Before the cock crows today, you will denyme three times." And he went out and he wept bitterly.

Narrator: Now the men who were holding Jesus mocked him and beat him; Theyalso blindfolded him and kept asking him:

Narrator: They kept heaping many other insults on him and reviling him. When the day came, the assembly of the elders of the people, both chief priests and scribes, gathered together, and they brought him to their council.

People: They said, "If you are the Christ, tell us."

Narrator: He replied, "If I tell you, you will not believe; and if I question you, you will not answer. But from now on the Son of man shall beseatedat the right hand of the power of God-"

People: All of them asked, "Are you then the Son of God?"

Narrator: And he said to them, "You say that I am."

People: Then they said "Blasphemy! What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from his own lips.Blasphemy! Oh, blasphemy!"

5. DAWN FRIDAY: JESUS BEFORE PILATE

Narrator: Then the whole company of them arose, and broughtJesus before Pontius Pilate.

People: They began to curse him, saying, "We found thisman pervertingournation, and forbidding us to pay taxes to Caesar, and saying that he himself is the Messiah, the King!"

Pilate: Then Pilate asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?

Narrator: He answered him, "You say so."

Pilate: Then Pilate said to the Chief Priests and the multitudes, "I find no

crime in this man."

People: But they were insistent, saying, "He stirs up the people by

teachingthroughout all Judea, from Galilee where he began even

to this place."

Pilate: When Pilate heard that he was a Galilean, of Herod's jurisdiction, he

sent him off to Herod.

Narrator: Where he was vehemently accused and treated with contempt,

mocked, and clothed in an elegant robe; and then sent back again to

Pilate.

Pilate: Pilate said to the rulers of the people, "You have brought me this

manasone who was perverting the people; and here I have

examined this man in your presence and have not found him guilty

of any charges you've brought against him. Neither has Herod for he

sent him back to us. Indeed, he has done nothingdeserving death. I

will therefore have him flogged andrelease him."

People: But they all cried out together, "Away with this man! Away! Away!

Release to us Barabbas."

Narrator: Barabbas!---a man who had been thrown into prison, for

insurrection and for murder.

Pilate: Pilate, wanting to release Jesus, addressed them once more.

People: But they kept shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

Pilate: Why? What evil has he done? I've found no crime in him deserving

death; I will therefore have him flogged and then release him.

People: But they were urgent, demanding with loud shouts thathe should

be crucified.

Narrator: And their voices prevailed.

Pilate: So Pilate gave his verdict that their demand should begranted. He

released the man they asked for, who had been put in prison for

insurrection andmurder, and handed Jesusover to their will.

6. FRIDAY MORNING: CRUCIFIXION

People: "Go to Dark Gethsemane" ELW 347(vs. 3)

Calvary's mournful mountain climb. There adoring at his feet,

mark that miracle of time, God's own sacrifice complete.

"It is finished!" hear him cry.Learn of Jesus Christ to die.

Narrator: And he handed Jesus over to their will.

All Men: As they led him away, they seized a man, Simon of Cyrene, who was

coming in from the country, and laid the cross on him, and made him

carry it behind Jesus.

All Women: A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him.

Jesus:

But Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weepforme, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For behold, thedaysare coming when they will say, "Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed." Then they will begin to say to the mountains, "Fall on us"; and to the hills, "Cover us." For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?" (pause)

Narrator: Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to deathwith him. When they came to the place, which is called the Skull, there they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one onhisleft.

All Women: There was an inscription over him: 'This is the king of the Jews."

Judas: One of the criminals who was hanged with him railed at him, saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!"

Peter: But the other rebuked him saying, "Do you not fear God, since we areunder the same sentence of condemnation? And we have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.'

People: Forgive us our trespasses. Deliver us from evil for Thine is the kingdom.

Narrator: And Jesus replied

People: And the power-

Narrator: "Truly, truly, I say to you"

People: And the glory -

Narrator: Today, you will be with me in Paradise."

People: Forever and ever. Amen!

Solo: Were you there?

Narrator: It was now about noon—and darkness cameover the whole land

until three in the afternoon, while the sun's light failed and thecurtain of the temple was torn in two, from the top to

(Silence)

And having said this, he breathed his last. (Pause)

7. LATE FIRDAY AFTERNOON: BURIAL

Solo: "Were you there?"

Pilate:

Now there was a good and righteous man named Joseph, who, though a member of the council, had not agreed to their plan and action. He came from the Jewish town of Arimathea, he was waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God. This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then he took it down, wrapped it in a linen cloth, and laid it in a rock-hewn tomb where no one had ever been laid.

Narrator: It was the day of Preparation, and the Sabbath was beginning.

All Women: The women who had come with him from Galilee followed, and they saw the tomb and how his body was laid. Then they returned and prepared spices and ointments-

Narrator: On the Sabbath they rested according to the commandment.

(Silence.)

8. CONFESSION AND PARDON

- P: My sisters and brothers, Christ shows us his love by becoming ahumble servant.Let us draw near to God and confess our sin in the truth ofGod'sSpirit.
- ALL: Most merciful God, we your Church confess that often our spirit has notbeenthat of Christ. Where we have failed to love one another as he lovesus, where wehave pledged loyalty to him with our lips and then betrayed, deserted, or deniedhim; forgive us, we pray; and by your spirit make us faithful in every time oftrial; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
- P: Who is in a position to condemn? Only Christ. But Christ suffered and died for us, was raised from the dead and ascendedon high for us, and continues to intercedefor us. Believe the good news: In the name of Christ, you are forgiven! Glory to God. **Amen.**

INTERCESSORY PRAYER

AM: End human trafficking in every nation. For children taken from their families, for men and women without hope, for governments and nonprofits seeking resolutions, let us pray.

C: Have mercy, O God.

AM: We pray for the world. This week from the Cycle of World Prayer we especially lift up Cambodia, Laos, and Vietnam. May they live in your peace and protection. Let us pray.

C: Have mercy, O God.

AM: Comfort the afflicted. For those imprisoned, for those waiting on death row, for all overwhelmed by sorrow, and for all who live with disease, chronic pain, and anxiety in this world (especially), let us pray.

C: Have mercy, O God.

AM: Enrich the children and youth of our congregation with an abundance of your Spirit. For each child in our community, for parents and guardians, for confirmation mentors and faith formation leaders, let us pray.

C: Have mercy, O God.

AM: Bless the ministry of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church of Saratoga, our sister congregation in our parish and we lift them up in prayer. Let us pray.

C: Have mercy, O God.

AM: Sustain the weary. For all who mourn, for all who yearn to be with you in paradise, for funeral home staff, for hospital chaplains and grief counselors, let us pray.

C: Have mercy, O God.

P: To you, gracious God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your boundless mercy; through Jesus Christ, our Savior.

C: Amen.

SUNDAY OF THE PASSION / PALM SUNDAY Blessed Is He!

Today is Palm Sunday, the day we hear again of Christ's ride into Jerusalem on a donkey to the acclaim of what must have seemed like the entire city. "Blessed is the king!" (Luke 19:38), cried men, women, and children, putting their cloaks both on the donkey on which Jesus rode, and on the road before him. The city burst with joy (Luke 19:37) because of the hope Jesus provided for the people. He who raised the dead—the widow of Nain's son (Luke 7:11-16), Jairus's twelve-year-old daughter (Luke 8:40-56), Lazarus (John 11)—what would he do next?

But Palm Sunday is not Easter. There is, in fact, a world of events between this Sunday and next. Joy will come again, joy greater and deeper than any Palm Sunday cry. But first, Jesus will be handed over to the authorities. All who put their cloaks on the road before him will rip them from under his feet. Jesus will stand alone, abandoned even by his closest friends. First will come suffering, crucifixion, death. On Palm Sunday, Jesus is the savior the crowd senses he is. But he will not save as they anticipate he will—by making Israel a great nation once more, by throwing off their Roman oppressor, by going toe-to-toe with power, and declaring victory in the fight.

Blessed is this Lord, indeed. He will save in an entirely unexpected way. He will save by pouring himself out for others, by answering hatred with love. Blessed is he! He will do this for love, by love, in love. Blessed is he. Death will not contain him—the one who brought a son, a daughter, a brother to life will himself be raised, the first fruits of all of those overcome by death themselves.

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
